Prosper Waco is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit created to serve as the backbone organization for a collective impact initiative to improve the education, health and financial security of people living in Waco, Texas.

Prosper Waco developed out of decades of work done by community members who wanted to see positive change. We emerged out of three existing groups: the Greater Waco Community Education Alliance, the Converging Health Collaboratives and the Poverty Solutions Initiative.
